How to Check Your Voter Registration

Voter rolls are regularly purged or marked inactive. Check you are registered correctly or update your registration ahead of time.

You can use these government sites directly to check your registration or to register or update your information and know your voting rights.



Alternatively, you can use this one-stop-shop information for voters.

FaithVotes is a non-partisan campaign of Interfaith Power and Light (IPL) who have partnered with BallotReady to enable people to get ready to vote and to be informed about their entire ballot.

Marching to the Polls

As a congregation, you could march to the polling station together, or take a group to dance and sing to the mailbox. And of course, you can pray.

Blessing of the Ballots

Rev. Richenda Fairhurst from the UM Creation Justice Movement has written these three prayers and a voting litany.

1. Getting Started - Prayer of Invocation:

Divine One, God of All and Bringer of Life, your Earth is a wonder of crystal water, pine forests, and wind-swept plains. In a moment I will mark my ballot. Grant me a heart of faith and discernment as I participate in this public process of voting. Let the light rise within me. Amen.

2. Delivering your Ballot - Prayer at the Ballot Box:

Creator, Deliverer, Light of lights. As I post/submit my ballot, let there be hope! Bless this ballot and the ballots of my neighbors. Let our choices rise with justice, kindness, and peace. Let us bring joy to this nation. Let our neighborhoods, our families, and the whole community of creation be blessed. In this public space, in this public act, let my ballot and my faithful citizenship be a mark of hope. For I am rooted in the good of this Earth and the love of God. Amen.

3. Prayer in your faith community - Prayer for concluding a shared conversation:

Creator, Deliverer, Light of lights. Let there be hope! Let the outcome of this election bring hope to many. Let our choices rise with justice, kindness, and peace. Let our discernment be a blessing for our neighbors. Let us bring joy to this nation. Let our neighborhoods, our families, and the whole community of creation be blessed. In this public space, with this public act, let our ballots and our faithful citizenship be a mark of hope. For we are rooted in the good of this Earth and the love of God. Amen.

Movement Cafés - Preparing for the Election

The United Methodist Creation Justice Movement runs monthly <u>Movement Cafés</u> (webinars/discussion) on the 2nd Wednesday of the month at 2 pm PT. In September there was also a bonus café.

The September cafes were to help churches prepare for the election and both were recorded.

The bonus café earlier in September, led by the Western Jurisdiction group was entitled *Faith Votes and the Environment.* Watch it here:

The September café was about Politics, Methodists and Environmental Holiness.

The café included Rev Keith Sexon, advocate for Creation Justice Advocacy in the North Carolina Annual Conference and a member of the UM Creation Justice Movement Advocacy Team, speaking about the research that they had done on Democrat and Republican quotes and policy statements relating to the climate. His presentation begins at about 18 minutes into the recording.

Rev. Richenda Fairhurst also spoke about the Revised Energy Policy Statement that passed at General Conference and the positions that we support as United Methodists. Her presentation begins about 35 minutes into the recording.
