Congregational Guidance for a time without precedence

Jim Antal, climate activist, author and public theologian serves as Special Advisor on Climate Justice to the General Minister and President of the United Church of Christ. He is also a committee member of Third Act Faith. In this article, Congregational Guidance for a time without precedence, he reflects on the critical role congregations can play in climate action at such a time as this. As he says: The role—the vocation—of the congregation, if it seeks to be faithful, must be responsive to major changes in its neighborhood, its country, and in the world. While worship attendance in America has dropped precipitously over the past few decades, it remains the case that about 24% of Americans attend worship at least once a week. That's an enormous number. So, on any given weekend, 24% of Americans can be found in worship, seated alongside neighbors with whom they sing from the same hymnal and listen to the same sermons. Imagine if only half of those congregations ...

Three Advocacy Opportunities

Make Big Oil pay for climate damages

This year California has a chance to pass a groundbreaking piece of climate legislation that would make polluters pay to protect our communities from the climate crisis. It's called the Climate Superfund Bill. The companies who are responsible for these climate-fueled disasters, like the January wildfires in Los Angeles, should be the ones to pay for the damages, not California residents. It's time for California to make polluters pay into a climate superfund that will get money to communities most in need of recovery and resilience. Vermont and New York already passed a Climate Superfund, let's make California next!

Oppose cuts to clean energy funding in the Inflation
 Reduction Act and the Infrastructure Investments and Jobs

Act

The Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) and the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) are the most significant investments by the federal government ever made to combat climate change. Leaders in both chambers have said they want to make deep cuts or do away completely with unspent funds in the IRA and IIJA. If this were to happen, it would seriously undermine the fight against climate change.

 Oppose cuts in funding to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA)

The research done by NOAA is critical to understanding what is going on with climate change. Without that research, we are flying blind as we seek to measure increases or decreases in greenhouse gas emissions and the impacts of mitigation efforts. In addition, NOAA is the source of the weather reports we see on the nightly news or our phones, warning us of potentially dangerous weather. Their work is vital.

A vegan lunch will be provided by the Himalayan Restaurant of Windsor.


Please note that there is no childcare being offered at this event.
