ACS Legislation



Our Task Force has submitted [four pieces of legislation](#) to this year's Annual Conference Session (ACS). Please follow the links to read them and encourage your pastor and lay delegates to support this legislation.

- **Resolution for Conference Fossil Fuel Divestment** asks the California-Nevada conference to transition all investment portfolios to low carbon and eventually fossil free funds and to report on progress in 2026.

Divestment Resolution

- **Recommendation to Spend 10 Minutes a Day in Nature** encourages all congregants to spend time daily outside in mindful connection with Creation.

10-Minutes Recommendation

- **Recommendation on Green Teams** encourages all congregations to establish green teams or equivalent for action in the four areas of connection, education, action and advocacy.

Green Teams Recommendation

- **Resolution to Boycott Chevron to Defend God's Creation and Human Rights** adds the California-Nevada Conference to the list of groups that are joining the global boycott of Chevron Corporation by signing the boycott statement of United Methodists for Kairos Response and encouraging congregations to mobilize boycott activities in their area.

House passes budget bill cutting clean energy tax credits

On May 22, the House of Representatives passed its version of the budget reconciliation bill, which dramatically slashes America's clean energy tax credits. The bill is now headed for the Senate. There is still time to contact your senator to ask them to preserve the tax credits, and their benefits, in their bill. 

First Earth Connect Retreat: A Meaningful Gathering



In spite of cool and sometimes rainy weather which kept the group indoors far more than was planned, the April 26 Earth Connect retreat, held at Windsor Community UMC, was a great first of what are hoped to be several such events to be held in different locations around the Annual Conference.



The day began with a gathering circle outside and a land acknowledgement presentation by Joe Salinas, a local artist and activist who leads the Sonoma County Pomo Dancers. He spoke about his efforts to instill a sense of pride, self-worth and

connection with the Earth among young people, and expressed his appreciation for allies who have come alongside to support an endeavor to change an offensively worded plaque at a local park, honor the first inhabitants there, and place educational markers at former tribal village sites. He ended by singing a prayer of blessing. Many participants said his presentation was a highlight of the day.



The participants were then invited to explore the church grounds and find one or two objects that struck them as “sacred.” They collected a variety -- leaves, stones, feathers, flowers etc. -- and arranged them to create an altar for the day. People introduced themselves by sharing what each object signified to them.



Presentations by retired clergy Liza Klein and Judith Preuss-Mellow introduced concepts of Creation Spirituality. Joan Pell shared about the work of the Climate Justice Ministries Task Force. Debbie Weatherspoon, Marylee Shaffer, Pamela Abbey and Glo Wellman facilitated small breakout groups. Laurie Bayen gave an orientation to the Sacred Ground smartphone app project. A delicious vegan lunch from a local Himalayan restaurant was enjoyed by all.

The group learned a song by Bret Hesla reminding us of our connection both to the Earth and to others:

*Put your hand on the ground.
Touch it like a prayer...
Somebody somewhere
is touching it too.*

Sir David Attenborough turned 99 years old on the day his latest film premiered in England. The film documents how the state of the world's oceans, and our understanding of how they function, have changed in the course of his lifetime. Sir David explores the planet's undersea habitats, revealing the greatest age of ocean discovery and emphasizing the ocean's vital importance while exposing its problems and highlighting opportunities for marine life recovery.

The film will premiere on National Geographic on Saturday, June 7 and be available to stream globally the following day Sunday June 8 which is **World Oceans Day**, on Disney+ and Hulu.
