Sun Day is a day of action on September 21, 2025, celebrating the power of clean energy

The clean energy revolution is here. Solar, wind and batteries are the cheapest form of power on the planet, lowering costs, creating new jobs, and strengthening our communities. But some politicians and industries are trying to hold it back.

Sun Day is a day of action to celebrate the power of clean energy. **On September 21st, people everywhere will be showcasing solar installations, electric homes and vehicles running on clean power.** By organizing thousands of events on the fall Equinox, Sun Day will help accelerate the ongoing clean energy revolution: we have the technology and the solutions, all we need is to build the political will to scale-up and accelerate clean energy and make it accessible to all.

Sun Day is a grassroots annual event founded by leading activist organizations who know how to turn actions into movements and words into policies, including: GreenFaith, California Interfaith Power & Light, Third Act, 350 and EarthDay.org.



Here Comes the Sun



We are beginning to hear lots of positive comments about Bill McKibben's upbeat and encouraging new book ***Here Comes the Sun: A Last Chance for the Climate and a Fresh Chance for Civilization***.

Bill McKibben, a climate activist and a United Methodist, was one of the first to sound the alarm about the climate crisis and he insists the moment is also full of possibility. Energy from the sun and wind is suddenly the cheapest power on the planet and growing faster than any energy source in history—if we can keep accelerating the pace, we have a chance.

In the introductory chapter, McKibben says, *Even as I write these pages, I'm helping organize what we're calling Sun Day, set for the autumnal equinox in September 2025. Indeed, some of the proceeds from this book are supporting that organizing process, because its goal is the same: to help people understand the possibility of our moment.*
